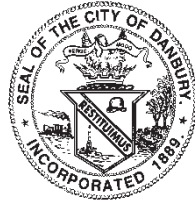

THOMAS FANNING

Tom Fanning is a true human rights activist whose vision has shaped the evolution of Ability Beyond, the 501(c) (3), not for profit organization he has led for the past 42 years. Under his leadership, Ability Beyond has emerged as a leader in the field, growing from an organization of a small group of parents who wanted a better life for their children in 1953, into a network of services that now supports close to 3,000 people with disabilities each and every year.

Tom's commitment to community inclusion and creating a better life for people living with disabilities has, and continues to make, a difference for a population that has historically been isolated from the rest of society. Tom Fanning does not treat people with disabilities as victims; rather, he looks past the disability and sees the many abilities that they possess and the potential they have to offer. His mission, and the mission of Ability Beyond, is to help people with disabilities to fully participate in their communities and enjoy the same things all members of a community enjoy.

The impact Tom has had on the community can be seen each and every day as people with disabilities are living, working, volunteering and enjoying life alongside those without disabilities. In addition to his dedication to people with disabilities, Tom has also been a loyal partner to many important causes in our community including The Hord Foundation. Among a number of awards and recognitions throughout the years, Tom was most recently awarded the 2015 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Connecticut Community Provider's Association.



EDWARD A. ROBBS

Edward A. Robbs was born in Terre Haute Indiana, the third of four brothers and three sisters raised by his mother Mary Rose Robbs-Bates. While they had little, it was enough. He enjoyed a great childhood. He attended the all black Booker T. Washington Elementary School through the sixth grade, when in 1954 with the Supreme Court decision (Brown vs. The Board of Education of Topeka KS) the schools became integrated. He then attended Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, and graduated from Wiley High School class of 1961.

He graduated from Indiana State University (formerly Indian State Teacher's College) in 1966 with a BS in Biological Science and a minor in Social Sciences. After graduation he moved to Los Angeles, CA where he taught science at Horace Mann Junior High School for ten years. During this time he earned a Master of Arts Degree in Educational Administration from California State University, Long Beach, followed by twenty-two years of experience in administration in the Los Angeles Unified School District. This included positions at Gardena High School in Gardena, Locke High School in Watts, and Banning High School in Wilmington. The last twelve years of his administrative experience in California was as a high school principal at Locke and Banning High Schools. His loyalty, dedication and commitment to education is beyond question.

He has received several commendations including the City of Los Angeles' Golden Apple Award for Community Service, a Proclamation from the City of Los Angeles and the P.T.A. Administrator of the Year Award. In addition to educational professional organizations, he has also been involved in civic organizations including The Rotary Club, Los Angeles Urban League, The Wilmington Chamber of Commerce and served on the Board of Directors of the Wilmington YMCA. In 2011, he received The Connecticut Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission – Humanitarian Award.

In 1998 he moved to Connecticut to become Principal of Broadview Middle School in Danbury where he has been for the past 18 years. During this time he has been an Adjunct Professor at Western Connecticut State University in the Education Psychology Department.

He volunteered with many Danbury community and civic organizations including Cherry Street Association, Pathways Board of Directors, Ability Beyond Executive Board, Coalition of African/American Organizations and Churches, The Danbury Juneteenth African-American Parade Committee, Dorothy Day House, Hord Academy Board and the Hord Foundation Board of Trustees. Over the past 10 years he served as Chairman of the Scholarship Program. The foundation has awarded over \$4.1M to over a couple thousand deserving African American students in greater Danbury. He also served as President of the Concerned Black Men for Youth.

Edward Robbs is retiring after 50 years as an Educator serving kids.

This year he will be celebrating 25 years of marriage to his wife Myrtle.

Maya Walton is a 2011 Danbury High School graduate and Hord Scholarship recipient. She attended college at Washington University (WUSTL) in St. Louis, where she graduated in 2015 with a major in Urban Studies and a minor in Legal Studies. Maya is currently a 2015 Teach for America Corpmember teaching American Literature at West Charlotte High School in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Glen Leroy Mourning was born in Danbury Connecticut. As the oldest of his mother's five children, Glen was blessed with the opportunity to lead by example where he would become the first of two generations to not only graduate from high school, but to complete a masters degree. In 2005 Glen earned a Full- Athletic Scholarship to attend the University of Connecticut where he would make the "All Big East Conference Academic Honor roll for two years in a row before graduating and attending grad school at the University of Bridgeport. In 2010 Glen finished his masters degree in Elementary Ed. and was named the Student teacher of the year at the University of Bridgeport.

Since then, Glen has worked alongside the nationally renowned educational contributor Dr. Steve Perry, Star of the CNN Special "Black in America II" and the host of TV One's "Save our Sons". As a 4th and 5th grade teacher at Capital Preparatory Magnet School in Hartford Connecticut, Glen managed to brilliantly inspire the lives of hundreds of students in his tenure as an educator. At the same time, he was the assistant Varsity football coach at Capital Prep where the team posted an incredible record of 35-2, winning the State Championship before stepping down from his role as defensive coordinator.

For the past two years, Glen has worked in South East Washington D.C as a 1st and 4th grade teacher at Democracy Prep Public Charter School. Next year, Glen will be assuming the role as Grade Level Chair and will be transitioning into the role of the Language Arts Coordinator at Democracy Prep. Glen's greatest accomplishments are not those that have occurred on the playing fields across America, but rather with his promise to his family that he has kept for the last seven years which was to become the motivation for his students that have come from similar circumstances.

Simon Obas is from Danbury and graduated from DHS in 2004. He attended the prestigious Historical Black College of Johnson C Smith University in Charlotte, NC. He then went on to pursue a Master's in Social Work from Fordham University. Simon is currently working on his a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership at Fordham University and is expecting to complete his studies in 2018.

Known for his love for children, integrity, and fairness, and sincere interest in the personal development of children of color, Simon has been working as an educator for the past 7 years. He's taught in New Haven, Bridgeport, and Harlem New York. In May of 2015 Simon became the founding Assistant Principal at The Charter High School for Law and Social Justice.

Simon is apart of the Kappa Delta Pi Education Honor Society and is also a proud member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. On February 1, 2016 Simon published his first book titled, The Grind.

Simon's personal mantra is "Give Thanks." He believes that no matter what life throws at you, there is ALWAYS a reason to be grateful, to never forget where you come from, and to be a cheerful giver when the right opportunity presents itself!

Bailey Brown hails from Brooklyn, New York and Danbury, Connecticut. She attended Park Avenue Elementary School, Wooster School, Rogers Park Middle School and Danbury High School. She received her undergraduate degree (Cum Laude) in Sociology from the University of Pennsylvania with minors in urban education and Africana studies. Bailey's senior thesis was awarded the E. Digby Baltzell Award for her work on low income families in West Philadelphia.

As an undergraduate, Bailey was selected to participate in the Ronald E. McNair Scholars program at her home institution and the Leadership Alliance research program at the University of Chicago. After receiving offers from University of Michigan, Northwestern University, and University of Chicago among others, Bailey chose to complete her PhD studies at Columbia due to the Sociology Department's strong faculty members and Columbia's ideal location for conducting work on urban education.

Currently, Bailey Brown is a third year PhD student in Sociology and a Paul F. Lazarsfeld Fellow. She received her Master's Degree in Sociology from Columbia University in May 2015. Bailey Brown was also awarded the Ford Foundation Predoctoral Award for her graduate study and selected to participate in Columbia's Fellowship program in Academic Administration where she works for the Office of Multicultural Affairs. Bailey studies urban sociology, social stratification/inequality, race/ethnicity and education. Her dissertation will focus on school choice for low income Black and Latino families.

In her spare time, Bailey enjoys reading novels, volunteering as a high school mentor and program manager for AMBYESE, and traveling. 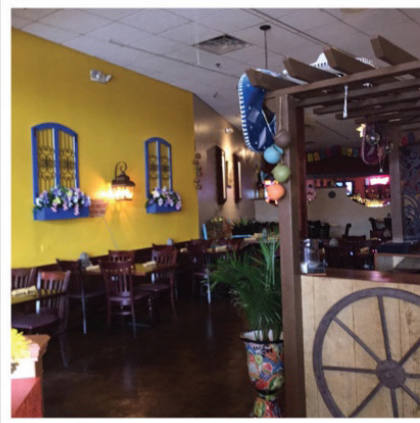
